WEEKLY ENVIRONMENTAL MEANDERINGS – On the 1st May, the UK Parliament approved a motion to declare an environment and climate emergency <https://bbc.in/2F8JwQH>. Following non-violent protests and talks over Easter, this is a hugely positive response, joining with the Welsh and Scottish governments and individual towns in the UK. However, there is still a long way to go and requires individuals such as all of us to act, as well as our governments. All the Weekly Environmental Hints, as well as lowering our thermostats by 1C, reducing our food waste as far as possible, and if not, adding it to our green bins (rather than our black bins), avoiding using compost derived from peat, avoiding buying products which wear out quickly and thinking about whether we should create a tool sharing hub in each of our villages?
