Environs

We appreciate the good level of support the village continues to enjoy from the District Teams and County Teams... ... The Streetscene Team for the grass cut around the village verges; the leaf and debris kerb sweepers - and the very prompt removal of fly tipping. Thanks also to the always helpful teams on the refuse/recycle and food bin collections.

We feel very well supported by our Locality Manager and the Teams who attend to highways maintenance over the year - we've had a number of potholes and some drainage issues addressed this year - as well as those little things that matter - flushing the gullies, ensuring the grit bins are replenished for winter, and keeping the grass verge and hedges at the Fosse well trimmed in the summer.

And we know there are some great behind-the-scenes teams whose work back at base involves support for our village.

Finance

I am pleased to report our financial position remains sound. With rising prices, our regular outgoings have increased and we did ask for a small rise

in the 2025-26 precept - the funding we receive from the District. This will affect a band D property by just over £1 a year.

The Leys - Fostering our Heritage

Has looked lovely in flower this Spring. We shall need to look at the area on the diagonal footpath towards the west entrance which had become very soggy over Winter and early Spring, likely groundwater rising - there used to be a pond thereabouts in the past. Contact will need to be made with County Ecology Services to seek their advice. Meanwhile the path is gently curving around the newly established watergrasses -and on firmer ground. With Many Thanks to Liz B who has been seen with mower on the paths last summer. We already have plans in place to review the drainage which was established in 2013 on the west boundary adjacent the lane.
